
CAMDEN WATER TRAIL





The Camden Water Trail is a 13-mile trail connecting current and future park lands and water access points. It aims to encourage recreation on and around the Back Channel and Cooper River, providing ample access sites and interpretive opportunities to users. This project is in Phase II with additional parks lands, access points and interpretive signs to be installed by 2023. Camden County Parks Department, Discover the Delaware partners and local officials are helping to make this vision a reality.

The Camden Water Trail hopes to include these sites with the following upgrades:

- Petty's Island Preserve
- Sadler's Poynt Waterfront Park: Install floating dock
- Pyne Poynt Park Beach: Redesigned
- Sadler's Marine Services: Potential park/boat house

- Farnham Park
- Gateway Park: Install dock
- Kaighn Avenue Dam: Install fish and boat passageway
- Cooper River Boathouse
- Cooper River Boat Ramp
- Cooper River Yacht Club
- Cooper River Park
